


Brown's largest event space, The Clarendon Room, is named after Clarendon House, once the grandest residence on Piccadilly.



The Roosevelt Room




Named after the great American President, Franklin Roosevelt who visited Brown's on his honeymoon with Eleanor Roosevelt.


- Refurbished in 2023


The Niagara Room



Lord Kelvin led the International Niagara Commission meeting at Brown's in 1890, where they agreed to use water power for electricity. This room commemorates this historic event.

The Lord Byron Room




Named after Lord Byron, the Romantic poet and politician. Byron's fortune, entrusted to his butler James Brown, led to the birth of Brown's Hotel.

The Graham Bell Room




It is believed that the very first telephone call in London made by its inventor, Alexander Graham Bell, took place at Brown's Hotel.

The St. George's Room


