<b>Pic poul de Pinet, Duc de Morny, Languedoc, France</b> Grown around the pretty coastal Mediterranean village of Pinet, where the vineyards overlook oyster beds, unsurprisingly this is crisp, very moreish and lovely with seafood too.	£9.50	£12.00	£33.00

### **Huia Sauvignon Blanc 2023, Marlborough, New Zealand**

£36.00

This is not your archetypal NZ Sauvignon as it has been aged for twelve months in old neutral oak casks. This 'broadens out' the wine a little. It still has that lovely herbaceous character but the ageing makes it work with food better. So versatile...works well with almost any first course or fish dish.

### **Godello 2021 C.V.N.E Pagos de Galir, Valdeorras, Spain**

£43.00

From one of Spain's most famous wine estates this is a fascinating wine. Grown at altitude in Galicia it is partially fermented in stainless steel and partly in barrel. The nett result is flavours of citric fruits and wild herbs with a refreshing touch of salinity. Ideal with fish dishes, white meats and cheese.

### **Macon-Villages 2022 Domaine Alexis Pollier, Burgundy, France**

£44.00

With ever increasing burgundy prices (although the demand is still there) the wines from the Maconnais continue to offer great value. The quality has also rocketed in recent years as well. Here we have beautifully pure ripe unoaked Chardonnay from the excellent 2022 vintage. Excellent white burgundy at the price.

### **Foxglove Chardonnay 2019, Varner Wines, California, USA.**

Brothers Jim and Bob Varner have built themselves a reputation for producing with freshness, varietal characteristics, minimal use of oak intervention and value! What could be better! This wine is similar to the Macon above but a touch richer having been enhanced with a touch of oak and Californian sunshine! Ideal to match rich terrines/pâtés and white meat dishes.

### **Pouilly-Fumé 2024 Domaine Treuillet, Loire Valley, France**

£48.00

Quite simply, we modestly say this is drop-dead gorgeous Pouilly-Fumé! Grown on limestone and flinty clay the wine is aged in stainless steel to emphasise its vibrancy, minerality and floral character. Perfect with fish dishes and white meats.

### **Chablis 2022, Domaine Bernard Defaix**

£59.00

Our vines on the appellation Chablis spread over 12 hectares, situated at the heart of the Chablisian vineyard. This wine is aged in stainless steel tanks so as to respect the typicity of the appellation. The bouquet displays a dominance of mineral notes, which are often associated with delicate touches of citrus fruit (lemon and grapefruit). Chablis goes well with white fish and seafood dishes especially oysters.

### **Bourgogne Blanc 'Les Sétilles' 2022 Olivier Leflaive. Burgundy, France**

£64.00

This is really classy white burgundy from one of the most respected producers of the region. Their wines higher up the ladder cost hundreds of pounds but this 'entry' level wine offers what good white burgundy is all about without breaking the bank.

### **Assyrtiko 2023, Vassaltis Estate, Santorini**

£66.00

The wines of Santorini are truly in vogue and rightly so. The beauty of the Assyrtiko grape is that even in a hot climate it does not lose its acidity. The wine has a wonderful mouthfeel, real texture created by the volcanic soils that the vines are grown in and a wonderful fresh saline character. An ideal partner to seafood dishes and quite an experience!

<b>Merlot 'Les Fleurs de Montblanc' 2023 Côtes de Thongue, France</b> This is the most versatile easy-drinking soft, juicy Merlot. No oak here, just lovely medium-weight fruit.	£8.00	£10.00	£29.00
<b>Atance Bobal 2022, Valencia, Spain</b> Bobal is the grape, local to the region. Having been grown at high altitude the wine has delightful freshness and 'crunchiness'. This could be described as Spain's equivalent to Beaujolais...medium-weight and works perfectly with almost any white or red meats dishes.	£8.50	£10.50	£30.00
<b>Shiraz, Soldiers Block, Victoria, Australia</b> Grown in cool Victorian vineyards around Melbourne, this Shiraz is not dark & heavy at all, you will find bright, juicy & aromatic fruit in here which make this highly drinkable.	£9.00	£11.00	£31.00
<b>Nero d'Avola 'Tre Filari' 2021, Enologica Cassara, Sicily</b> Another wine from Sicily that really over-delivers. With more weight and spice than the two reds above it is an ideal match for red roasts and grills.	9.00	£11.00	£32.00

<b>Chateau Tour de Biot 2020, A.C Bordeaux, France</b> This is an inexpensive Bordeaux that offers an awful lot for the money! Proper claret from a great vintage. **Côtes-du-Rhône 2022, Nicolas Boiron, Rhone Valley, France**

This is fabulous big juicy fruit from one of the top producers in Châteauneuf-du-Pape..... Nicolas Boiron, sixth generation owner of Domaine Bosquet-des-Papes...just delicious!

**Château Maison-Neuve 'Cuvée Alexia' 2020 A.C. Blaye-Côtes de Bordeaux**

£41.00

Named after the proprietor and winemaker Alexia Eymas, this Bordeaux, from the Right Bank some fifteen miles north of the town of Blaye is a tremendous find and great value. Made from a blend of Merlot and Malbec it was raised entirely in tank and whilst offering all the classic claret characteristics it maintains freshness and perfect balance. Another red to enjoy with red meat dishes or strong flavoured pasta dishes.

**Babel 2020, Stellenbosch, western Cape, South Africa, Babylonstoren**

£43.00

48% shiraz, 13% merlot, 11% petit verdot, 10% malbec, 10% cabernet franc & 7% pinotage. A delicious bouquet of crushed mulberry, blackberry & plum with layers of sweet spice, vanilla & dark chocolate. Perfect with spiced pork, lamb and rich stews.

**Moulin-à-Vent 'Cuvée de Thorins' 2022 Château de Moulin-à-Vent, Beaujolais, France**

£44.00

Everyone seems to head to Fleurie when it comes to Beaujolais so we are steering you away to another of the ten villages or 'Cru' as they are known. Made entirely from the Gamay grape it is a combination of red-style fruits with a touch of blue fruit characters as well....beautifully pure elegant flavours.

**Châteauneuf-du-Pape 'Cuvée Tradition' Domaine Bosquet-des-Papes, Rhone Valley, France**

£71.00

Made predominately from the Grenache grape with a splash or two of Syrah, Mourvèdre, Vaccarèse, Counoise and Cinsault the wine packs a punch but is actually elegant, fresh and with 'lifted' fruit with layer after layer on the palate. Drink with either red or white meat dishes.

**Barolo 'Cascina' Nuova' Elvio Cogno, Piedmont, Italy**

£74.00

This renowned 15 hectare estate has been taken to new levels. The wine oozes elegance and finesse with silky, soft, 'lacey' tannins and one could be forgiven for thinking you are drinking Pinot Noir not Nebbiolo. This is a wine that over-delivers massively when it comes to quality/price.

**Nebukadnesar 2018, Simonsberg Mountain, Western Cape, South Africa Babylonstoren**

A lovely intense nose of violets and thyme with blackcurrants. A beautiful full bodied wine with layers of dark red fruits supported by light, well honed tannins. Opulent and sophisticated. Perfect with lamb and beef.

This is the third wine from the legendary Chateau Margaux estate...one of the five great 'first growth' wines from Bordeaux. More accessible than the 'grand vin' it offers wine enthusiasts a gateway into the world of Chateau Margaux, renowned for its elegance and finesse.

**Santenay Rouge 1er Cru 'La Maladière' 2017, Les Héritiers Saint-Genys**

This comes from an outstanding vintage for red wines in Burgundy. A tiny vineyard in La Côte de Beaune. This wine has spent 1yr ageing in oak barrels to add further complexity. Long finish, hugely satisfying and a wonderful example of top red Burgundy.
