
Our experienced and dedicated team will offer you support throughout the essential planning stages and ensure that your wedding day is everything that you dream of, and more.

THE OCTAGON

The Octagon can accommodate ceremonies for up to 240 guests.

This stunning venue was built in 1888 and was originally the Queen Mary library, designed by Victorian architect ER Robson and inspired by the Reading Room at the British Museum.

The domed ceiling reaches an impressive three storeys high and busts of famous literati surround the dome including Shakespeare, Wordsworth and Chaucer to name a few.

Pre-approved external caterers are permitted into this incredible Grade II listed space, enabling you to create the wedding day of your dreams.


Our dedicated team of Wedding Coordinators will provide support and guidance and work closely with both you and your chosen external suppliers in the lead up to your special day.
